3. Chairman's remarks

Highlights of the year:

- Major streetlight conversion programme to LED plus selective reduced hours on some lights results in reduced
 electricity costs to partially offset steep price rises: a big thank you to Cllr Hodges for all his hard work on helping
 to achieve this very satisfactory outcome. Added bonus of anticipated major maintenance cost savings given more
 the reliable infrastructure. This ensures that future Precept increases can be better controlled
- Double Yellow lines on Mears Ashby near School finally approved to help road safety. Expected to be appear this
 year priority and weather permitting
- School closure in July after 170 years on Church Lane. PC looking to mark the contribution to our children with a wall plaque on the old building
- Now have a robust PC website, better managed and increasing usage
- Individual Parish Councillors have taken on responsibility for specific areas of activity which has helped improve efficiency
- Retirement of one Parish Councillor (Marian Harland) leaving a vacancy. Thanks to her for her service to the village.
- Final year of the current Parish Council before a new one is elected in May 2025. A new Chairman will be required [as Cllr Borrett] not intending to stand again for office after 35 years of dedicated service to the village
- Th PC's hard working and extremely professional Clerk, Vicky Smith, is due a huge thank you for managing our affairs so well during another challenging year

4. Parking on Main Road

Nightmare on Main Road. Thirteen cars last night parked outside as the 'forecourt' is full. Not helpful that only those parked illegally can be subject to Police/parking enforcement. Residents are intimidated by the rude, arrogant, bullying manner of the operator of garage, whose attitude is 'move if you don't like it'. Get a driveway. It was agreed the situation is appalling.
